Socio-Economic Dimensions in Extended Working Lives

Active ageing is attributed to a steady extension of working careers since the mid-1990s, and due mainly to the closing of pathways to early retirement. This year's conference is a cooperation of the FACTAGE project (Fairer Active Ageing for Europe), the Society for Social Progress, the German Federal Pension Insurance and the Research Institute of the German Federal Pension Insurance (Forschungsnetzwerk Alterssicherung) and discusses manifold efforts of policymakers in Europe.

The conference presents among others parts of the FACTAGE project, which is exploring the emerging inequalities associated with longer working lives. The concept of well-being in later life is reflected in multiple dimensions, including labour market integration, pension incomes, and health. Along with the expansion of working lives, those dimensions are expected to be influenced and change around socioeconomic groups. In addition, the conference presents important results on the transition from working life to retirement from projects of the Research Institute of the German Federal Pension Insurance.

Therefore, the conference focuses on effects from longer working lives and discusses the role of institutional arrangements, experiences of ageing and well-being across social groups, changes in the classical model of family and care obligations. By providing an interdisciplinary and international insight on the impact of Active Ageing, opportunities and challenges for future old age policies will be discussed.
